How to Enter and Criteria

We are delighted that you are interested in entering your work to be considered for the *BAR Open Access in Archaeology Award*, which will offer an OA publishing contract worth up to £10,000. Please find below information on the award criteria, what is needed to apply and links to the Entry Form and Terms & Conditions.

The expert panel of judges will decide on the award winner based on which entry makes the most innovative contribution to the field of archaeology.

For shortlisting purposes the following criteria will be considered

- Takes the subject in new and distinctive directions
- Is original and imaginative and makes people think in new ways
- Develops new theoretical or methodological approaches
- Presents data in a new way
- Contributes to wider society
- Makes connections which have not been made before, especially with other disciplines
- The submitted work must be original research and not previously published

Particularly welcome are projects which give prominence to minoritized voices in archaeology.

Other conditions to be fulfilled

- Entries are to be sent by email to award@barpublishing.com, and must be received by 30th September 2021
- Manuscripts must be in English, French, German, Italian or Spanish (or other languages, provided an English translation is submitted at the same time)
- The final, published book should be between 80 and 400 pages in extent
- The entrant should have the scope to complete the manuscript in time to publish the book in 2022

The OA publishing contract for the award winner is subject to delivery of the full draft manuscript by 31 May 2022 and positive peer review of that draft thereafter.
