For all books published into the BAR series, the exclusive publishing licence (that is, the right for the material to be reproduced in any form) is owned by the publisher. This means that, whilst the copyright (intellectual property) may remain with the author, the rights regarding any future reproduction in any form remain with the publisher.

If you have made a full manuscript available prior to our peer review, we ask you to submit full details of the sites and number of downloads on our ‘new proposal submission form’. This will be taken into consideration as part of our evaluation process.
