



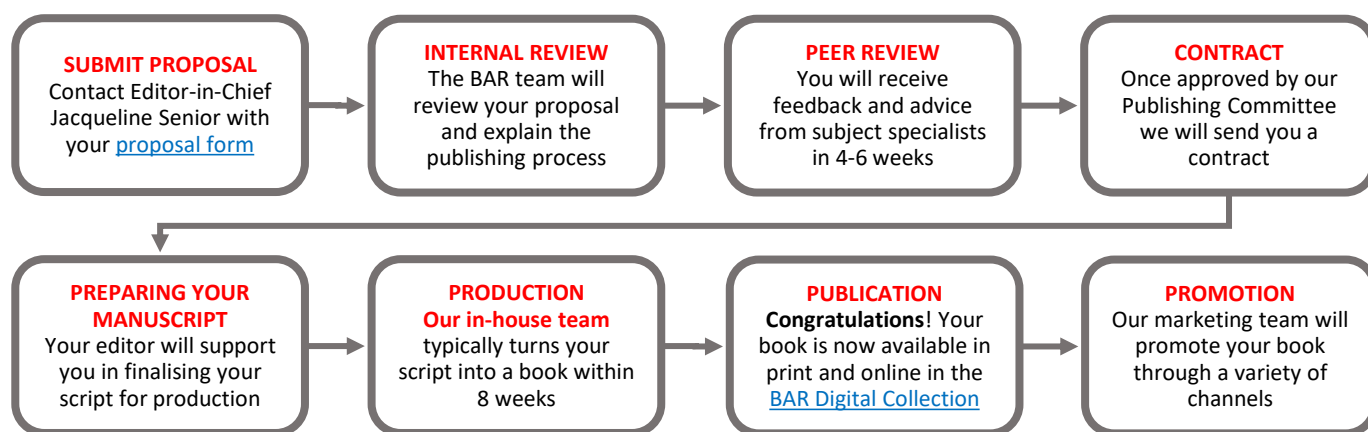
## *Archaeological Studies on Late Antique and Early Medieval Europe, 400-1000 CE*

### Route to Publication



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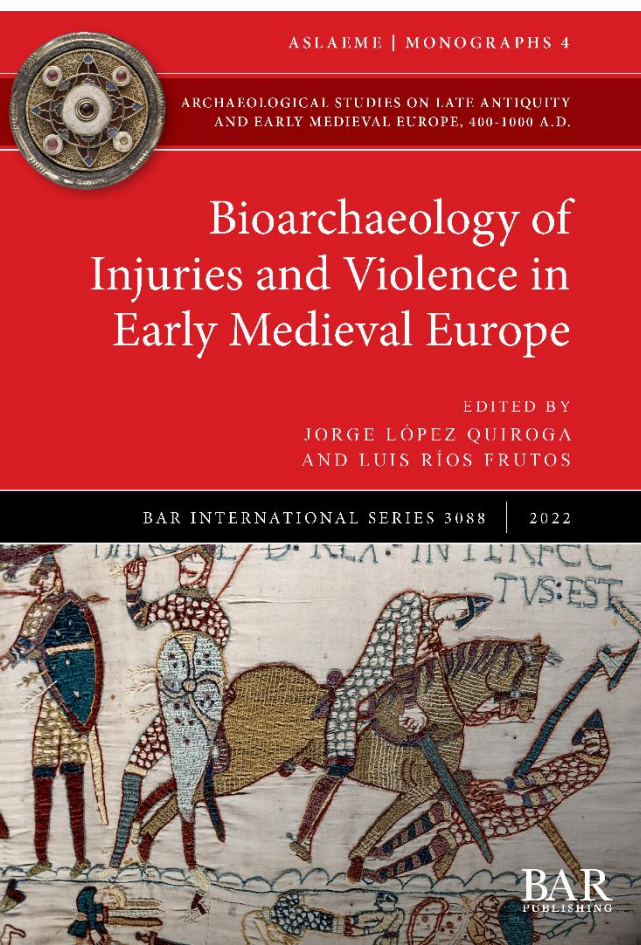
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
