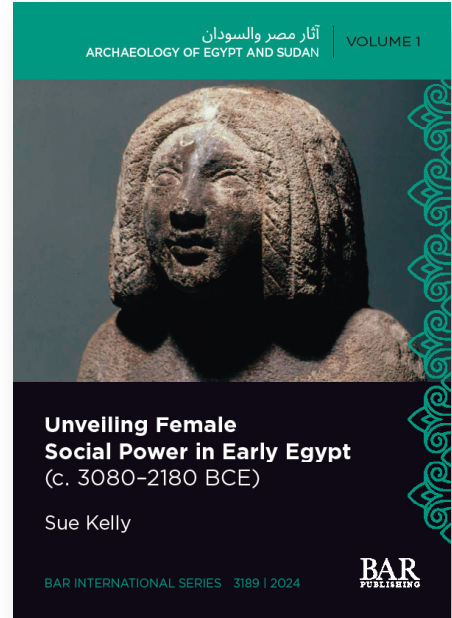
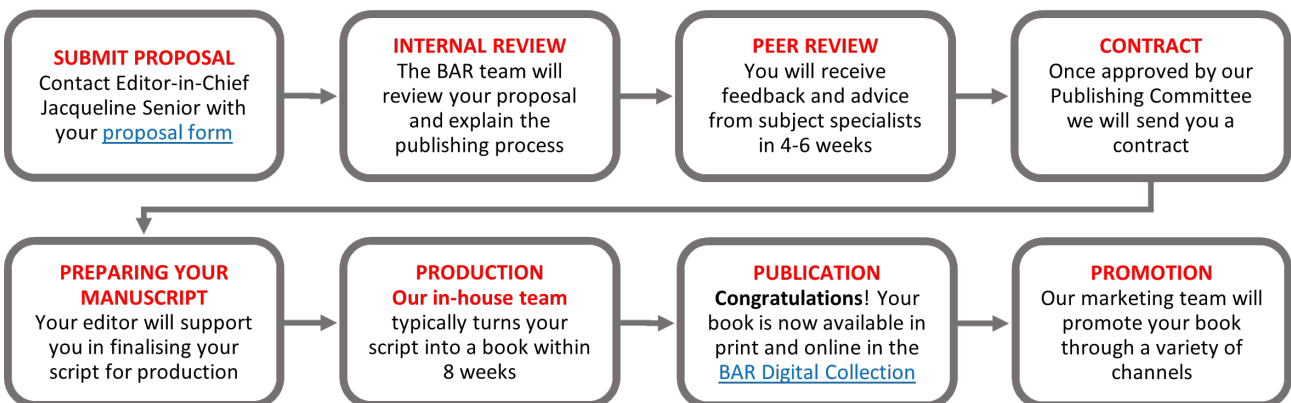

Books will be published in print and in digital format, with both no cost and Open Access routes available.

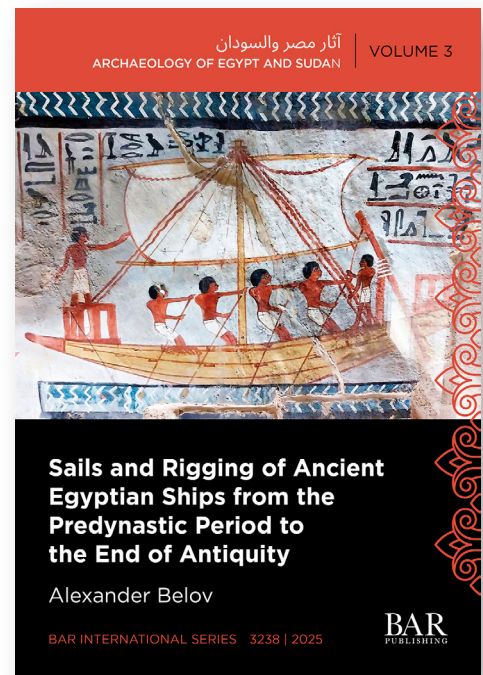
